WHAT IFS - MANAGING CIRCUMSTANCES OUTSIDE OF YOUR CONTROL

It is finally time to take your Spring Break trip! You finish work and excitedly pack your bags to board a flight for vacation. You are inundated with the normal distractions - work, small talk, and family matters. You board the flight, buckle, and settle in until you reach cruising altitude at 35,000 feet.

Shortly after takeoff, you feel the plane start to shake. **Turbulence is normal - and expected**. A small bump here and there reminds you of the "small bumps" we typically encounter throughout our days as practicing dentists. All of a sudden, the plane starts shaking up and down, then left to right, much like being on a boat in choppy waters. Next, your stomach starts to drop, similar to being on a roller coaster, but you don't get to regain sturdy ground.

Now, your stomach is aloft, nerves are rising, and you are hoping this ends soon. But the turbulence begins to worsen and doesn't let up. You feel the plane trying to fly higher, moving faster, and then it slows due to the winds working against it. You look around to see everyone else's faces also looking around. People asking, "What's going on?" After 15-20 minutes you expect to hear from the flight attendants or the pilot over the intercom, but no consolation is offered.

Peering outside the airplane windows, it is evident you are flying through a storm. It's dark and raining outside. Loud cracks of thunder and flashes of lightning fill the sky around you. Other passengers are grabbing their seats, holding hands, grasping tightly to their kids and loved ones.

It has now been 30 minutes of severe turbulence, the shaking of the airplane is causing audible shouts and sounds of distress from the passengers. Looking around, you see fear, confusion, and panic on the faces of those around you. The flight attendants finally make

a statement over the intercom, in which you can hear uncertainty and fright in their own voice as they relay a message to stay seated and that you are flying through a storm.

The questions have already raced through everyone's minds. What if the storm worsens? Will the airplane be able to tolerate this for much longer? What if the oxygen masks drop down? What if the plane crashes? What if...?

After 45 minutes of severe turbulence, the pilot finally makes a statement over the intercom. He explains that we are almost through the storm and to expect another 15 minutes of turbulence before we are in the clear.

This is the experience my family and I endured on March 14, 2024 flying from Fort Wayne, IN to Tampa, FL.

As the plane landed at our destination, passengers cheered - clapping and hugging in relief that we had made it to the ground safely. The pilots did not say their farewells as we walked off the plane. Instead, they sat in the cockpit, looking dejected and shocked at what had just transpired. As everyone waited for their luggage, also in shock at what we had experienced, strangers were hugging each other - in relief that we were all alive.

We later came to learn it wasn't a typical storm, but in fact a tornado (or several) that we flew through. We also learned that our airplane was struck by lightning mid-flight. A flight attendant from our flight, who had 3 APRIL Spring Fling



over 20 years of experience, said that it was the worst flight she had ever been on.

As there have not been any commercial airline accidents with fatalities in the last several years, the likelihood of our plane crashing was very low. 1 in 11 million to be exact. But what if it had been our plane? What if it was the one flight in the news stories and headlines? As planes fly all day, everyday, what if our flight had been that one that didn't make it?

I do not share this experience to instill fear of flying. Rather, I view it as a reminder that we have little control over most aspects of our lives, both within and outside of dentistry. In the field of dentistry, 'what ifs', whether big or small, can cross our minds daily.

What if my employees don't show up to work? What if my patients cancel? What if my patients don't pay? What if my procedural outcome isn't as desired? What if my patient gets angry at me?

As dentists, we are wired to analyze situations. At times, I find myself investing a lot of energy and effort into analyzing circumstances that are outside of my control. It is much easier to tell my friends and fellow colleagues to "not sweat the small stuff" than it is to apply in my own life. However, this flight was an intense reminder to keep things in perspective and prioritize what is in my control and what's most important in my life.

While there are plenty of variables outside of our control, we should focus on what is in our control. Living life with fear of circumstances outside of our control can cause overwhelming stress, which will not only harm yourself, but negatively impact procedural

outcomes, employees, and relationships outside of work. As we place more energy into addressing the aspects of life (and dentistry) that we can control, outcomes will improve, resulting in lessened stress levels and greater feelings of personal and professional satisfaction.

Finding freedom from worry and purpose in the 'What Ifs' can help us find direction and stability as we navigate the unknown.

Freedom from worry is a process.

- 1) Ask yourself, "What is the worst that can possibly happen? Did I do everything in my power to prevent it?"
- 2) Prepare to accept it if you have to.
- 3) Then calmly proceed to improve the worst-case outcome.

A sense of peace from acceptance of varying circumstances will allow you to move forward and devote time and energy into improving the 'What if' scenarios.

As practitioners, we can find the composure to accept the things we cannot change, courage to change the things we can, and wisdom to know the difference - living one day at a time, enjoying one moment at a time, accepting hardships as they come. Here's to friendly skies (and happy patients) for the rest of 2024!



LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE & DENTAL DAY @ THE CAPITOL

Isaac Knapp members came out in full force to support **Dental Day at the Capitol on February 5th** to show support for legislation that positively impacts dentistry.

Our very own Representative Dr. Denny Zent participated on a panel discussion at the Indiana Teachers Association building with other legislators, including Senator Liz Brown. IDA members and IU School of Dentistry students were able to ask questions and learn more about the legislative process and how policy impacts dentistry.

After the opportunity to learn about current dental topics, participants were invited to meet with their local legislators or tour the State Capitol building.

This solid force of support for dentistry helped pave the path for important legislation that later passed and was signed into law. Senator Liz Brown and Rep. Dr. Denny Zent sponsored **SEA 132**, which addresses a number of healthcare issues, including IDA-supported language that would require insurance companies to honor patients' request that benefits be assigned to the dental office that provides care. While once the assumed payment method, in recent years some carriers have ignored **Assignment of Benefits (AOB)** requests by patients as leverage to pressure dentists into joining their provider networks.

The bill also requires insurance companies to notify the dentist before selling or leasing their network to another insurance company.

A veteran of the Korean War, Dr. Zent has spent a lifetime dedicated to public service. During Dr. Zent's tenure in the legislature, huge strides in the dental profession were made

under his leadership. Such legislative accomplishments include the passing of Non-Covered Services, Network Leasing, and Assignment of Benefits.

- The fact that dental school debt can often run more than \$250,000 upon graduation, which puts many new dentists in a financial position where treating Medicaid patients is not feasible

Dentistry is at a critical juncture. State and federal politicians could very well decide what kind of practice you'll be running and what type of care your patients will be receiving in the future. Make sure your voice is heard. Dentists know what's best for dentistry!



LEAP OF FAITH

A little over a year ago, I remember feeling anxious. We had officially announced to our members the debut of a new program, Future Leaders of Isaac Knapp. After about two or more years in the making, the Isaac Knapp District Dental Society and Dental Education Foundation boards helped launch a new program designed for dentists by dentists.

New things are scary. I was allowing the what-ifs Dr. Yager alluded to to consume my mind. What if we can't make this program sustainable? What if the cohort thinks it is a waste of time? What if we fail?

To understand where we are today, I want to share with you how FLIK came to fruition. Four years ago, we sent out surveys during Covid to help us identify areas that we could help our IKDDS members most.

From the surveys, we identified that comradery and mentorship seemed to be a continual theme to what our dentists were truly seeking. We then narrowed our survey to young dentists.

While many of the same themes presented, we also saw a hunger for connection and opportunity for personal and professional development.

In late 2020, I reached out to **Dr. Matt Kolkman**. He had just accepted the role of Treasurer and in my attempts to start working ahead, I asked him if he had any goals that he'd like to achieve by the time his term as President came along. He expressed his heart to **build strong dental leaders** and his involvement with the **YDC**.

One late night, I was in my office re-reading through all the survey results. The world was crazy with Covid and I desperately wanted to figure out a new way to help. I wrote on my whiteboard some of the recurring themes and then wrote down what Dr. Kolkman had expressed. A rough framework of a program for our member dentists appeared. I sent Dr. Kolkman a picture of my

whiteboard and he responded, "Let's meet for coffee to discuss."

In 2021, we pulled **Dr. Joe Platt** into brainstorming sessions. We were simply identifying what topics would be of value and how we could make a program like this work. We then presented it to our IKDDS board and they approved for us to create a taskforce to further develop. We added **Dr. Tom Blake and Dr. Caroline Derrow** to the task force.

For about a year, we met regularly. Then, we realized that our vision was a little out of our league and we needed help. After researching several consulting firms, we discovered **Bulldog Consulting**. They were exactly what we were looking for and the value they provided was top tier.

In 2022, both the Isaac Knapp Dental Society and the Dental Education Foundation boards worked out a plan to help provide funding to hire Bulldog Consulting.

Mike Filson from Bulldog Consulting proved to be a missing piece that was needed to complete the program.

We set a deadline to launch the program in the Fall of 2023. Then, we had an even bigger ask to our board. We asked members of both boards to consider being part of a beta cohort. We knew we were asking for a valuable resource of both time and money to support an unproven and new program.

Jansen, Dr. Emily Johnson, Dr. Matt Kolkman, Dr. Brendan O'Hara, Dr. Joseph Platt, and Dr. Jill Torkeo stepped out on faith and applied to be part of the beta cohort.

All of them were leaders already in their own right some may even suggest this group of leaders were in a season of their career where they didn't "need" this type of program.

That may possibly be the reason why they were the perfect inaugural cohort. This past year, they have been willing to participate and be fully engaged. The amount of wisdom and feedback during programming days has been invaluable.

I will forever be **grateful for both boards** who spent a considerable amount of time refining and challenging us to create a better program.

I am thankful for the **task force members** who selflessly gave their time, wisdom, and insight to design a program that could help others. The brilliance of these IKDDS members is a society treasure.
